Gospel Reading: Mark 8:27-38

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' And they answered him, 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.' He asked them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered him, 'You are the Messiah.' And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him. Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.' He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ### Sacrament of Baptism

<u>WORDS OF PREPARATION</u>: One of the most significant celebrations of the Christian Church is the Sacrament of Baptism. As we witness the sacrament, we are reminded of our own baptism, of God's claim upon us, and of our own call to be part of the ministry of Christ's reconciliation and of God's mercy. We remember that God has called us each by name and that we all are unique and treasured children of God. The sacrament of baptism is a visible and outward sign of the grace of God.

For centuries, baptism has been the way of entrance into the universal church of Jesus Christ. It is the recognition of the goodness of God in each and every child. In baptism we acknowledge the need for fresh wisdom and strength gifted to us in each and every generation. Arlo Nix Gosman, the God who claimed Jesus as his beloved Son, and who has claimed each of us as beloved children, today claims you as a beloved child.

<u>SCRIPTURE LESSON</u>: Hear these words from the gospel of Matthew: At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a child, whom he put in front of them, and said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me."

<u>PROMISES OF THE PARENTS</u>: Max and Maren, you have brought your child here desiring his Christian baptism. You now engage, on your part, to do those things that will show the good will and love of God to him that he may grow into the love and nurture and direction of the Lord.

Do you promise that you will teach this child the principles of the Christian faith and that you will pray with him and for him, and that you will keep him within the community of Christ's church? **We do.** 

<u>PROMISE OF THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY</u>: Do you, the members and friends of this church, representing the whole Body of Christ, receive this child into your love and care, and do you promise that so far as you are able, you will uphold and encourage the parents in the fulfillment of their promise this day? **We promise our love, support, and care.** 

<u>BLESSING OF THE WATER</u>: Throughout the story of faith, water has been a way in which God has delivered the faithful. In creation, God brought forth the beauty of creation from the raging water. The people of Israel crossed the waters of the Red Sea on their way to a land of promise. Jesus was baptized by John in the waters of the Jordan and heard the voice of God which claimed him as a beloved Son.

Bless this water by your Holy Spirit, Gracious God. By your Spirit, create new life in Arlo Gosman, that he may rise in glory and beauty in Christ. Glory to you, the one who was, and is, and ever shall be. AMEN.

### ACT OF BAPTISM and PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTIZED






